15. Interdisciplinary Learning at Saheed Kshudiram College Saheed Kshudiram College has embarked on a pioneering initiative to foster interdisciplinary learning among its various departments. Recognizing the value of interdisciplinary education in cultivating well-rounded individuals with a holistic understanding of the world, the college has introduced collaborative classes involving departments such as History, Bengali, English, Sanskrit, Political Science, Philosophy, Education, Physical Education, Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics, and Environmental Science. This report provides an overview of these interdisciplinary classes and their impact on students' academic and intellectual growth. Objectives The primary objectives of implementing interdisciplinary classes at Saheed Kshudiram College are: To encourage students to explore connections between different disciplines. To promote critical thinking and problem-solving skills. To facilitate a comprehensive understanding of complex issues through multiple perspectives. To prepare students for interdisciplinary challenges in their future careers. Implementation Interdisciplinary classes are conducted through a collaborative effort involving faculty members from participating departments, and this initiative is reflected in the central routine. These classes integrate concepts, theories, and methodologies from multiple disciplines, providing students with a broader framework for analysis and inquiry. For example: A class might explore the historical, literary, and philosophical dimensions of a particular period in history, incorporating perspectives from History, Bengali, English, and Philosophy departments. A class on environmental sustainability might draw upon insights from Environmental Science, Political Science, and Economics. In alignment with the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, the

college has also initiated the Four-Year Undergraduate Program (FYUGP) as per guidelines set by the affiliating university, the University of North Bengal. This initiative aims to enhance academic flexibility and provide a robust interdisciplinary foundation for students. Impact The interdisciplinary classes at Saheed Kshudiram College have had several positive impacts on students: Enhanced Critical Thinking: Students are encouraged to think critically and analytically about complex issues by approaching them from various disciplinary angles. Broadened Perspectives: Interdisciplinary classes expose students to diverse viewpoints, helping them develop a more nuanced understanding of subjects beyond their primary area of study. Improved Problem-Solving Skills: By grappling with interdisciplinary challenges, students learn to apply knowledge and skills from different disciplines to solve real-world problems creatively. Increased Engagement: The collaborative nature of interdisciplinary classes fosters active participation and engagement among students, leading to a more enriching learning experience. Preparation for Future Careers: In an increasingly interconnected world, interdisciplinary skills are highly valued in various professional fields. These classes equip students with the versatility and adaptability needed to succeed in their future careers. Conclusion The implementation of interdisciplinary classes at Saheed Kshudiram College represents a significant step towards fostering a culture of interdisciplinary learning and innovation. By breaking down disciplinary boundaries and encouraging collaboration, these classes are equipping students with the skills and knowledge needed to thrive in an increasingly complex and interconnected world. With continued support and investment, interdisciplinary education at the college is poised to make even greater strides in the years to come.

16.Academic bank of credits (ABC):

An Academic Bank of Credit (ABC) is a system utilized in some educational institutions to facilitate the accumulation, transfer, and recognition of academic credits earned by students. The concept is analogous to a financial bank where credits earned through courses or other learning experiences are deposited, stored, and can later be withdrawn or transferred as needed. Saheed Kshudiram College has partially adopted the Academic Bank of Credit (ABC) system by implementing the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) from the academic session 2018-19. In alignment with the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, the college has also initiated the Four-Year Undergraduate Program (FYUGP) as per guidelines set by the affiliating university, the University of North Bengal. Ad during the academic year 2023-24 the process is full adopted by the college. However, other features of the Academic Bank of Credit (ABC) system are yet to be implemented in the institution. Historical Understanding: Students gain a deeper understanding of Indian history through firsthand exposure to the historical significance of monuments and sites, fostering an appreciation for the contributions of various civilizations and dynasties. Interdisciplinary Learning: The field study integrates knowledge from history, art, archaeology, and cultural studies, encouraging students to analyze historical sites from multiple perspectives. This approach nurtures critical thinking and analytical skills. Personal Growth: The experience fosters personal development by challenging students to step out of their comfort zones, engage with unfamiliar environments, and appreciate diverse cultural contexts. Many students report a sense of personal transformation and increased confidence. Community Engagement: Interaction with local communities near historical sites allows students to learn

about cultural practices and traditions, fostering mutual respect, understanding, and a sense of connection to India's heritage. Promotion of Indian Heritage: The field study raises awareness about preserving and protecting historical sites and monuments. Students are sensitized to issues such as heritage conservation and the importance of sustainable tourism practices. Conclusion The historical field study initiative by the Department of History at Saheed Kshudiram College has made a profound impact in promoting Indian culture and knowledge systems. By offering firsthand exposure to significant historical landmarks, it has enhanced cultural awareness, deepened historical understanding, promoted interdisciplinary learning, facilitated personal growth, and strengthened community engagement. Such initiatives are vital for nurturing a generation of informed and culturally sensitive individuals who are proud custodians of India's rich cultural heritage and are equipped to contribute to its preservation and promotion.

19. Focus on Outcome based education (OBE): Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):

Outcome-Based Education (OBE) aims to prepare students not only for their first job but also for lifelong learning and career advancement. By focusing on the development of transferable skills such as critical thinking, communication, and problemsolving, OBE helps students adapt to the changing demands of the workforce. At Saheed Kshudiram College, students benefit from structured academic programs designed to support their pursuit of higher education and career opportunities in both government and private sectors. To further enhance Outcome-Based Education, the college is introducing Add-On Courses tailored to equip students with practical skills and interdisciplinary knowledge. Decisions regarding the introduction of Add-On Courses for the academic year include the following: Communicative Sanskrit by the Department of Sanskrit Spoken English by the Department of English Mathematical Reasoning by the Department of Mathematics Global Warming by the Department of Political Science Creative Writing and Script Writing in Bengali by the Department of Bengali Traditional Knowledge of Indian Art by the Department of History Tourism Management by Geography These initiatives reflect the college's commitment to providing a comprehensive education that emphasizes practical learning and skill development, aligning with the principles of OBE.

20.Distance education/online education:

As a result of the COVID-19 pandemic, the entire academic session was conducted through online teaching, learning, and evaluation

methods. Educators provided study materials, shared links to freely accessible resources, and compiled question banks for openbook or assignment-based online examinations. Students actively participated in online examinations, and assessments were conducted through both online and offline means. Even after the end of the pandemic, the college IQAC decided to continue with a blended mode of education to leverage the benefits of both online and offline learning. To further enhance educational opportunities, the college initiated a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with Netaji Subhas Open University on 20th September 2021, aimed at promoting distance education on the college campus. A second MoU was signed with Netaji Subhas Open University on 18th December 2022 to further expand the scope of online education and foster continued collaboration in this domain.

2.2.1 - The institution assesses the learning levels of the students and organizes special Programmes for advanced learners and slow learners

Classes are distributed among the Teachers based on the government norms. Teachers take the assigned classes each semester in a regulated manner to ensure the timely coverage of the assigned topics per the academic calendar. All students cannot properly grasp the lessons/teachings within the given time. Some students feel discomfort and start lagging in learning due to unavoidable constraints of online teaching, and the unavailability of books at hand. To reduce the discomfort of such students, Teachers prepared study materials and shared them over Google Drive. The materials also served semester-wise in WhatsApp group and the academic resource section of the college website. To cater for the special needs of slow learners, Teachers arrange special classes and remedial to remove their uneasiness. Group discussions and quiz contests are arranged to encourage the learners. Student seminar on the particular course is conducted to encourage slow learners. For advanced learners, different departments conduct tutorials to provide an easy and clear understanding of a topic. They are also encouraged to participate in various online courses and webinars so that they can listen to eminent academicians.

2.3 - Teaching- Learning Process

2.3.1 - Student centric methods, such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem solving methodologies are used for enhancing learning experiences

Interactive sessions were conducted where students were given various platforms to explore their creative side. The students also took an active part in various webinars and symposiums at the departmental and inter-departmental level which were conducted keeping in mind the mental and physical wellbeing of all the stakeholders of the institution. Students were also given individual as well as group-based research projects to promote an active learning process. A few new Add-on courses were introduced. Under the leadership of the CarrierGuidance cell, a few workshops were conducted to enhance the learning process and motivate the students. The students were also updated on the new modes and avenues of learning to create a multidisciplinary approach and skill-based learning. At the departmental level, participative learning was encouraged through tutorial learning and dissertations. The career-oriented programmes were also conducted through projects and promoted in an interdisciplinary approach. Slow learners were identified by the mentor. The problems of the slow learners were resolved by the mentors through appropriate remdials. Advanced learners were suggested differently for their improvements.

Internal assessment is taken by each department at least two times during any semester. Internal assessment is an integral part of the CBCS framework. It is carried out at two levels based on the planning of the department. At the beginning of an academic session schedule for Internal Assessment is shared with the students following the academic calendar. Before the examination for Internal Assessment, Teachers of various departments conduct several examinations like oral tests, class tests, home assignments, surprise tests, student seminars, Group discussions etc. as per the academic calendar. Results of all such class tests are shared with the students and the slow learners are also informed about the ways for their improvements. Doubts are cleared and students are made aware of their mistakes. Although Teachers conduct various types of examinations, Marks of such examinations are not counted. The schedulefor Internal assessment is notified by the departments before the university examination. Students are evaluated in a transparent way. This time, due to the restriction imposed by the government for a pandemic, Students were asked to face online exams, Seminars and open-book exams.

2.5.2 - Mechanism to deal with internal examination related grievances is transparent, time- bound and efficient

The examination system at Saheed Kshudiram College, Alipurduar, West Bengal, ensures transparency and efficiency through a comprehensive assessment framework under the Choice-Based Credit System (CBCS) FYUGP. Evaluations comprise cumulative internal assessments (CIE) and university semester examinations to track academic progress. CIE includes at least two internal examinations per semester conducted by departments using diverse methods like group discussions, projects, student seminars, and written tests. Attendance is also considered in grading. The examination committee, under the supervision of the teacher in charge and departmental faculty, centrally manages the CIE.

To address grievances, the college employs a structured and timebound system. CIE results are uploaded to the college website, allowing students to submit grievances to the examination committee within a week. The convener communicates these to the respective department heads for reassessment, resolving issues promptly within a week. Reassessment results are declared immediately.

For university-level evaluations, the college facilitates Post Publication Review (PPR) and Post Publication Scrutiny (PPS), ensuring swift redressal of discrepancies. This system fosters a transparent and student-friendly environment, reducing stress and maintaining academic integrity. By acting as an intermediary between students and the university, the college ensures prompt resolution of concerns, supporting students' academic journeys effectively.

4.1 - Physical Facilities

4.1.1 - The Institution has adequate infrastructure and physical facilities for teaching- learning. viz., classrooms, laboratories, computing equipment etc.

Saheed Kshudiram College demonstrates its commitment to quality education through its well-planned infrastructure and facilities, meeting the minimum requirements specified by statutory bodies. The college operates across three buildings: Block-A, Block-B, and Block-C, housing 35 classrooms, of which 7 are equipped with LCD projectors and 1 with an overhead projector, enhancing modern teaching methodologies. The 2 seminar halls of the college has the facility with LAN and portable projector.

The institution has five laboratories, catering to diverse academic needs. The Geography lab and GIS lab are particularly noteworthy; the GIS lab is equipped with 9 computers installed with QGIS software and a well-organized seating arrangement for students. Additionally, the Physics and Chemistry labs are fully equipped to support hands-on experiments and research activities. The language has 5 computers and 10 headphones.

The college provides 24 computers across its facilities, ensuring digital literacy and access to online resources. The library, with its rich collection of books and journals, along with Wi-Fi connectivity, supports e-learning and research. Furthermore, the college maintains accessibility features such as ramps for differently-abled students.

With its blend of traditional and modern facilities, Saheed Kshudiram College fosters a conducive environment for holistic and innovative learning; ensuring students and faculty are equipped with the tools necessary to achieve academic excellence.

4.1.2 - The Institution has adequate facilities for cultural activities, sports, games (indoor, outdoor), gymnasium, yoga centre etc.

Saheed Kshudiram College provides comprehensive facilities for sports, games, and cultural activities, ensuring holistic development for students. The institution has two sports fields: a smaller field measuring 20 meters by 50 meters and a larger playground spanning 200 meters by 100 meters. Both fields, established in 2003, are equipped for outdoor sports such as football, cricket, and athletics.

Indoor sports facilities include spaces for table tennis, chess, and carrom, encouraging student participation in recreational and competitive activities. Yoga is donein an open field, fostering mental and physical well-being, with four yoga mats available for use.

Cultural activities are held in two seminar halls and on a permanent open stage. The first seminar hall, established in 2016, measures 20 feet by 70 feet, while the second, introduced in 2023, is more spacious at 20 feet by 200 feet. The open stage, constructed in 2024, measures 40 feet by 30 feet and serves as a dynamic venue for cultural performances and events.

These facilities are widely utilized, ensuring a vibrant campus environment. With its combination of indoor and outdoor amenities, Saheed Kshudiram College supports diverse extracurricular and cultural activities, fostering overall growth and engagement.

4.3 - IT Infrastructure

4.3.1 - Institution frequently updates its IT facilities including Wi-Fi

The college boasts a robust IT infrastructure with wired and wireless networks ensuring uninterrupted high-speed connectivity. The wired network, powered by Alliance Broadband, offers 110 Mbps speed with download and upload rates of 94.73 Mbps and 94.81 Mbps, and a low latency of 18 ms. A 109 Mbps Wi-Fi network, provided by BSNL under a state initiative, delivers FTTH connectivity across the campus for students, faculty, and staff.

Network security is fortified with firewalls, intrusion detection systems, encryption protocols, and Quick Heal Antivirus (v15.1.0.3). The campus has 43 desktops from brands like HP and Lenovo, equipped with Intel i5/i3 processors, 4-8GB RAM, 512GB SSDs, and 1TB HDDs, complemented by peripherals like Lenovo wireless mice and Mente keyboards. Smart classrooms feature LG and Hyundai smart TVs, projectors, and 4K HD interactive panels for interactive learning. Faculty utilize the Learning Management Systems such as Moodle, Canvas, and Google Classroom to manage resources and conduct virtual classes. The library employs KOHA software (v23.11.08) on a Linux-based platform for digital cataloging and barcoding of books. Its independent website offers access to e-books, journals, and other academic resources. Administrative processes are streamlined with Student Information Systems (SIS) and HRMS for managing records, payroll, and workflows. Campus security is ensured through 49 CCTV cameras, biometric access, and real-time monitoring systems.

The institution's dynamic website, managed by M9 IT Consulting, operates on a cloud VPS with 4GB memory, 2 vCPUs, 80GB SSD storage, and 4TB transfer capacity, supporting seamless online services.

For electrical services, an Annual Maintenance Contract (AMC) is in place with a skilled electrician. Maintenance of computers and IT facilities is ensured through the collective efforts of office staff and faculty members, who are mindful of their proper use. Repairs to computers and IT infrastructure are carried out by hired technicians as needed. Additionally, an AMC with a broadband internet service provider ensures the seamless operation of internet services in the college.

Laboratory equipment is maintained at the departmental level by the staff or, when required, by hired technicians. The library staff oversees the maintenance of library books and computers. Classroom facilities, including lights, fans, chairs, benches, and desks, are monitored regularly, with necessary actions taken promptly when issues are identified.

- Being state-government employees, all the teaching and nonteaching staff of the college avail the General Provident Fund (GPF) scheme which presently gives 7.1% interest on the savings. If necessary, employees can take loans or withdraw money from this account on both a non-refundable and refundable basis.
- 2. There is also a health insurance policy like the West Bengal Health Scheme and Swastha Sathi maintained by the Government of West Bengal. All the employees serving the college on a substantive basis can avail of this policy.
- 3. All the employees on a substantive basis can avail of 10 (10) medical Leave with full pay or 20 (twenty) medical leave with half pay. Maternity Leave for 180 days and CCL for 30 days is available as per govt rules. Eligible staff get bonuses, festival advances and Ex-gratia from the college fund.

6.5.1 - Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) has contributed significantly for institutionalizing the quality assurance strategies and processes

In the academic year, the IQAC at Shaheed Kshudiram College undertook significant initiatives to enhance institutional quality. Separate offices were allocated for Honours departments, while infrastructure improvements included upgraded washrooms, weekly cleaning, hand wash facilities, and improved drinking water systems. Seven departments conducted skill-based add-on courses like Spoken English and Tourism Management, aligning with NEP 2020. IIQA and SSR submissions for NAAC accreditation were completed. Proposals for student and teacher research funding, offering ?5000 and ?10,000 respectively, were introduced to promote innovation. Digital upgrades included interactive panels and EPTZ cameras for auditoriums and the language lab, along with library computer enhancements and book acquisitions. Scholarships for marginalized students were expanded, and alumni fees of ?500 were introduced to support welfare schemes. Academic, administrative, gender, and green audits were successfully conducted, complemented by faculty self-appraisals, showcasing the college's commitment to quality enhancement and holistic development.

Saheed Kshudiram College is dedicated to a comprehensive waste management system. Around 45 bins strategically placed across the campus facilitate the daily collection and proper disposal of both biodegradable and non-biodegradable solid wastes. The college demonstrates environmental responsibility by establishing two cemented tanks to process organic waste, derived mainly from plant debris, effectively curbing soil pollution and enhancing fertility.

In terms of liquid waste, the canteen optimizes water used for washing vegetables by redirecting it to nourish plants. Septic tanks within the campus manage liquid waste, although a dedicated recycling system for liquid waste is yet to be established. Addressing the critical issue of e-waste, the college has designated a specific room in the B.A. building. Here, a meticulous process of identification, segregation, and recycling is undertaken. Old desktops undergo recycling, toners are repurposed, LED bulbs and calling bells are repaired, and obsolete computer parts find reuse. Additionally, the college actively engages in the resale of outdated generators, contributing to a sustainable and eco-friendly approach in managing electronic waste.

Best Practice 1: Inclusive Decision-Making Process

The college employs a transparent organizational structure, clearly outlined in the organogram on its website. Regular meetings, open forums, and feedback mechanisms are established to foster communication and collaboration among stakeholders. However, it is acknowledged that limited expertise among stakeholders may sometimes result in less-informed decisions.

The college employs a mentor-mentee system involving both external mentors (teachers from other departments) and internal mentors (substantive and SACT teachers within the department). Students from various semesters in Honours Streams are assigned as mentees. This system encourages open communication, with students sharing their challenges, aspirations, and needs with their mentors. In one instance, the Geography Department used autobiographies to identify issues faced by slow learners. Unfortunately, resource constraints prevent the extension of this system to general and program course students due to a poor teacher-student ratio

Saheed Kshudiram College, Kamakhyaguri, stands as a key institution, playing a crucial role in supporting nearby villages and closed tea gardens like 'New Lands Tea Garden' and 'Sankosh Tea Garden.' In the academic year 2023-24 of the 2,802 enrolled students, 41.6% were from Scheduled Castes (SC), 13.05% from Scheduled Tribes (ST), and 9.98% from Other Backward Classes (OBC), totalling 65.08% from marginalized sections. The college also attracts first-generation learners from diverse linguistic and ethnic backgrounds in tea garden areas.

Despite resource limitations, the institution empowers students by nurturing their potential, fostering confidence, and supporting educational aspirations. Over 60% of students received government scholarships under various schemes.

Situated in a rural area, the college fulfils its social responsibility through social outreach programs, village adoption and various initiatives, providing holistic education. NSS Units conduct annual special camps for community empowerment, while NCC cadets engage in awareness, disaster management, and community development. These efforts instil social responsibility, environmental stewardship, and empathy in students, positively impacting the community's overall development. Saheed Kshudiram College remains dedicated to both education and community service, embodying a beacon of higher education in the region.
